## **Employment History:**

## Assistant Professor in Occupational Therapy University of Mary, Bismarck, ND 2011-current

Responsible for designing and teaching entry-level doctoral coursework related to occupational therapy theory, practice, interventions, and research. Responsibilities also include advising graduate Occupational Therapy Students throughout their coursework, supervising graduate occupational therapy student research projects, and mentoring students on their doctoral capstone projects. I serve as the Occupational Therapy program Chair for Professional and Academic Standards. I supervise students during their pro-bono clinic, Level I fieldwork students in the community, and organize and implement an international Level I fieldwork in Peru. I am also the advisor for the Student Occupational Therapy Association. I serve on the University-wide assessment committee, Program evaluation committee, the servant leadership scholarship committee, Faculty research grant committee, and the Institutional Review Board committee.

## Nurse Assistant Mealtime Aide, Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Bismarck, ND 2022-current

Responsible for assisting residents to and from the dining room prior to and following mealtimes. During mealtimes I assist residents who are unable to feed themselves in the dining room while observing for any swallowing difficulty. I document and report swallowing observations to the charge nurse, document levels of assist for all residents, and also document how much each resident consumed. Once everyone has eaten in the dining room, I provide feeding assistance to residents who are unable to come

to the dining room for mealtimes and document swallowing observations, levels of assist, and how much was consumed. I then collect all of the meal trays from residents' rooms on the entire unit and provide transfer assistance as needed for residents requiring two-person transfers.

## Dementia Care Nurse Assistant, Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Bismarck, ND 2022-2023

Responsible for providing basic care and companionship for residents residing in the locked dementia care unit. Basic cares provided included feeding during mealtimes and snacks, grooming, hygiene, dressing, toileting and bathing. One on one activities were also encouraged with each resident to increase socialization and sensory stimulation. A team-based approach was implemented on the unit to address dementia-related behaviors to ensure resident and staff safety while promoting individual autonomy and function. Light housekeeping and laundry was also completed during every shift. Accurate and timely documentation on the cares provided, resident activities, and behaviors was also required of the position. The locked dementia until closed and residents were transferred out of the facility in October 2023.

# Demographic Entry Specialist, North Dakota Department of Health, Microbiology, Bismarck, ND 2020-2021

Responsible for entering patient demographics data into the Starlims computer program for the State of North Dakota during the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Responsibilities also included communicating positive COVID-19 cases to the North Dakota Department of Health nursing staff, working collaboratively with the staff microbiologists ensuring accuracy of COVID-19 reported cases, creating and packaging COVID-19 testing kits to be shipped across the state of North Dakota, and filing/storing all COVID-19 testing documentation.

## Staff Occupational Therapist, Rehab Visions, Dickinson, ND 2006-2011

Responsible for providing occupational therapy services to individuals in an outpatient setting. Clients primarily were pediatric with various medical and/or genetic conditions. Duties included assessment/evaluation, intervention, and consultation of the child while communicating with pediatricians, occupational therapy assistants, families, insurance agencies, and other service providers of that child to provide an optimum continuum of care. Other outpatient clients typically treated included individuals with CVA, SCI, TBI, and hand injuries. This position also required assessment/evaluation, intervention, and consultation with residents of a contracted Skilled Nursing and Assisted Living Facility. Duties included scheduling/organizing treatment schedules, managing and supervising occupational therapy assistants, and completing the appropriate paperwork per Medicare regulations. On occasion, job duties expanded to provide assessment/evaluation and interventions to patients from a contracted Hospital. Most individuals served were in acute care or transitional care, and had conditions related to the adult later lifespan. Common conditions seen were total hip and knee replacements, back pain, acute CVA, vestibular disorders, weakness, low vision, and frequent falling, and fractures.

### OT Fieldwork Coordinator/Educator, Rehab Visions, Dickinson, ND 2006-2011

Responsible for providing fieldwork supervision for Level 1 and Level 2 occupational therapy students in the variety of settings we served. Job duties included educating students on facility policies and procedures, organizing student schedules, completing scheduled student meetings, and providing feedback to students in order for them to function at an expected level.

## Staff Occupational Therapist, St. Joseph's Hospital, Dickinson, ND 2004-2006

Responsible for providing occupational therapy services to individuals throughout the hospital, as well as home-health care. Duties included assessment/evaluation of individuals in acute care, transitional care, outpatient, and mental health-inpatient and outpatient. Most individuals served in acute care, transitional care, and home-health care had conditions associated with the adult-later lifespan including total hip and knee replacements, back pain, acute CVA, cardiac and respiratory conditions, vestibular disorders, weakness, low vision, and frequent falling, and fractures. Mental health services included evaluation/assessment and providing intervention by leading groups to adults and adolescents who were inpatient and in an outpatient setting. Common diagnosis or conditions included depression/anxiety, personality disorders, trauma, suicide attempts/ideation, schizophrenia, dementia, eating disorders, and self-harming behaviors. Additional duties included managing and organizing my schedule, collaborating and supervising with occupational therapy assistants, reporting to physicians, psychiatrists, nurses, social workers, and other health care providers.
